The feedback received from participants has been more than positive.

In addition to our Flight and Sportsman cars, we had an inside display with five cars. This special display was managed and coordinated by Chris Henry and is described in detail elsewhere in this newsletter. Thank you, Chris.

And we also had the NCRS store at the event managed by Dave and Tracy King. All of the publications handled by the store were on display and available for purchase as well as enrolling new members and reinstating memberships. NCRS Judging School

Also, on March 15th and 16th, NCRS held a Judging School in Dallas, TX which I attended. This school is usually held every 3 years but was postponed in 2020 due to Covid. It is open to all NCRS members and is well worth attending.

The judging school is a 2-day event with the first day being classroom sessions and the second day having hands-on judging. The day 1 sessions focused on judging paint & fiberglass, judging awards, standard deductions, etiquette & ethics, and matrix judging using C,D,C,I,F. Day 2 included hands-on judging of interior, exterior, chassis, and mechanical in a team of two. Each team was paired with an instructor that reviewed judging technique and scoring.




C2 / C3 Big Block with Power Steering Belt tightening help when you are alone Chris Henry If you have or had a BB with power steering, you know how difficult it is

to get to the adjustment bolt on the steering pump.

It's easier to get to from underneath the frame. The wrench is a one and half inch open end and will fit and hold the pump to let you put pressure on the belt. Then use a strap to hold the tension, giving you the time to get to the 2 pump bolts under the car.









C6 Window Regulator Replacement


If you have a C6 and the window binds during operation this might be your problem. Disassembly of the door panel is straight forward except in my case someone had this panel off before and had overtightened the center mounting bolt breaking though the plastic part of the panel. The mounting is backed up with a metal bracket on the panel but since it was below the surface, I had to pull the panel out bending the bracket to gain access to the bolt head. I was able to straighten the bracket before I put it back together.





Inspection will show you the regulator mounting bolts will be covered by black insulation pads. Just peel them back for access.

Remove the glass to regulator clamp bolts and raise the window to the full up position. You can restrain the window with grey tape. Remove the regulator assembly from the door. If you haven't done so, you may be surprised when you look for a replacement regulator. They are **NOT** available aftermarket and the cost of GM's part runs \$500.00+. My friend requested the option of used. Research showed used were available for around \$200.00+. The first one I purchased arrived DOA.





Let me add you **MUST** perform a relearn procedure by completing the electrical connection and then holding the window switch in the up position for a few seconds. The window regulator will cycle letting you know it is ready to operate. Reconnect the glass to the regulator and make any window adjustments for proper weatherstrip sealing. Reinstall door panel and savor your work. Be sure if you purchase used that you can return the part & get a refund.
